


LLOYD SHEA TROPHY

She will be missed.




Christmas is creeping up on us and a wonderful way to begin our holiday celebrations is with our club Christmas party.


Because our club has increased in size, it was decided to move our party to the Fisherman's Hall. Not only is there more room for us but there is better parking.


As usual, there will be a band to entertain us-and for dancing for those so inclined.
